Hyper-Reach “News Release” for Public Registration

Henderson County has contracted with Hyper-Reach a mass emergency public notification and alert provider system designed to warn citizens about local emergencies, hazards and other threats throughout Henderson City and County.

The new emergency alert system (hyper-reach) will provide rapid notification of hazardous and urgent situations using a mix of telephone calls, text and email messages, and even TTY/TDD service for the hearing impaired. Hyper-Reach provides Henderson with access to the Wireless Emergency Alert system developed by FEMA enabling broadcast text messages to most mobile phones.

“Our job is to protect the citizens of Henderson County as effectively as possible.” Said Larry Koerber, Director of Emergency Management for Henderson County.
